During her distinguished 16-year tenure at Punahou, Emily McCarren taught all levels of Spanish, traveled the world as head of the Wo International Center, and championed the aspirations of nearly 2,000 students, faculty, and staff as Academy Principal. She led consequential initiatives guided by her creativity and passion to forge meaningful educational experiences aimed at helping students reach new heights. McCarren began her career teaching Spanish and Geometry at Swiss Semester, a program for American students in the Swiss Alps. Next, she worked at The Thacher School in Ojai, California, where she taught, coached, and served as a residential advisor for six years before joining the faculty at the Punahou School in 2006.

With Yong Zhao and other collaborators, McCarren is a co-author of the three-book series Take Action Guide to World Class Learners (Corwin, 2016). She has also served on the Board of the Global Online Academy and the Mastery Transcript Consortium. McCarren speaks to audiences globally about her passion, leadership, and action towards educational change and the moral imperative to provide our students with the schools they deserve, and our world needs.

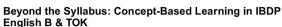
#### Beyond the Story: Unlocking Big Ideas through Children's Literature

How can a single picture book explore identity, responsibility, or change? This 90-minute, hands-on workshop empowers K-5 educators to strategically use children's literature as a portal to conceptual understanding. We will move beyond basic comprehension to explore how books like The Dot (creativity), Stone Soup (cooperation, community), or The Great Kapok Tree (interdependence) serve as perfect vehicles for deep, conceptual inquiry. Learn a practical framework for selecting texts and framing essential questions that turn read-alouds into vibrant discussions about life's big ideas. You will practice designing a mini-lesson sequence that uses a book's narrative to help students grapple with abstract concepts, transferring their understanding from the story to their own world. #### **Empowering Student Thinking through Concept-Based Inquiry Mathematics**

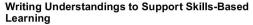

## Leading Concept-Based Curriculum Development in a VUCA world

Traditional change leadership models require leaders to predict the impact of their strategy on future outcomes when they are applied to the important task of reforming the curriculum. However, in our contemporary world - which is characterised by Volatility, Uncertainty, Complexity, and Ambiguity ("VUCA") - such traditional approaches often fail, because one can no longer assume that the future is predictable or that the impact of transformational leadership will be straightforward. This session will explore why this is, and the alternative approaches that we as educational leaders can take to leading concept-based curriculum development amid the complexities of modern schools and society. It will provide a number of tools that leaders can use to help navigate VUCA in their schools while maintaining the focus on what students need from the curriculum in order to thrive.

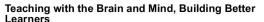

#### Teaching to Lead: Why Great Leaders Still Teach- a case for leaders to teach, co-teach or plan with their teachers

#### Multilingualizing Concept-Based Learning: Leveraging All Languages to Scaffold and Extend Learning

Students' languages are rich resources for learning that we can leverage intentionally through our lesson and unit design. Multilingualizing learning means making space within our lessons and units for students' various languages, designing learning so that students are enabled to use all of their language resources to scaffold and extend learning. We will explore concepts like pedagogical translanguaging and linguistic repertoire to develop an understanding of what it means to multilingualize learning, why it is so important, and how we can Dulwich College Suzhou do it intentionally though our learning design. We will inquire into the essential role concept-based approaches play in driving this shift towards inclusive, multilingual learning for all, exploring each phase of the concept-based inquiry cycle through the lenses of translanguaging and multilingualism. This session will include an opportunity to work collaboratively on planning a concept-based lesson or learning experience that is intentionally multilingual.
